Hello and welcome to our latest newsletter, which provides an update on the developments at Myton Green. You will have noticed some big changes as the site takes shape, with the first phase of major infrastructure delivery underway.

It's going to be a work in progress for all of us for the next couple of years, and we continue to welcome feedback to ensure we make Myton Green a great place to live.

Works update

• Work began in earnest onsite in early June, with the start of the highway improvements to Europa Way following closely behind in July. The works are expected to last approximately 56 weeks.

• Initial work has included stripping off topsoil and subsoil materials, so the ground

- \cdot Installation of new foul and storm water sewers along the spine road to service housing plots.
- Balancing ponds are being formed, to store storm water in periods of heavy rain. This will allow the water to enter the existing system at a controlled rate

can be profiled to the correct levels for roads and landscaping areas.

• Approximately 75,000m3 of soil has been moved to date, and the majority redistributed within the site to provide landscaped areas.

• Exceptionally dry conditions, has meant we have made good progress on the earthwork operations. However the unprecedented hot weather has resulted in other challenges as the sandy soils on the site create a lot of dust when dry. To mitigate this we have put additional measures in place and Warwickshire District Council's Planning Enforcement Team have visited site to review the work, and are satisfied we are managing the dust as best as reasonably possible.

 \cdot We apologise for any dust that may escape the site, and we will continue to monitor operations to minimise disruption.

Moving forward

 \cdot Earthwork activities are continuing to complete the profile of the landscape areas.

• On Europa Way the alignment of the new carriageway is being formed and the Statutory Authorities are diverting cables into the new verges to allow for the new road to be constructed.

• New pathways and cycle routes will be formed which will run around the whole perimeter of the site and through the 'green corridor'.

A452 Europa Way corridor works

The A452 Europa Way corridor is a key route between the M40, Learnington Spa and Warwick. It is currently operating at capacity with heavy congestion at peak times. The Warwick District Local Plan has identified that approximately 4,500 homes will be built within the corridor by 2029.

A programme of transport improvements for the corridor is being coordinated by Warwickshire County Council, with some of the work being led by developers and other work by the County Council.

As part of our infrastructure works we will be working with the County Council to deliver the first phase of the improvement works between our site access and the Tachbrook Park roundabout to the north.
